Your professional society is a member of ABET and evaluates postsecondary degree-granting programs in your discipline. If you are a good communicator, a true team player, and a respected member of your profession, then you may qualify to serve your society as an ABET program evaluator.

Program evaluators become intimately involved in educational quality assurance.

These volunteers consider whether a program meets criteria set by their profession. They review the program's self-study report, travel to campus for a three-day site visit, meet with institution representatives and students, and write an evaluation report documenting their observations.



Program evaluators are dedicated technical professionals.

They may be deans, department heads, faculty members, industry leaders, government representatives, or private practitioners, but they all share a demonstrated interest in contributing to their professions and improving higher education.

Program evaluators are highly skilled as employees and as individuals.

At a minimum, potential program evaluators must be technically current in their field, effective at communicating both orally and in writing, interpersonally skilled, team-oriented, professional in appearance and in demeanor, and organized.
